

3rd International Conference of Evidence-Based Health Care Teachers & Developers

-he 3rd International Conference of Evidence-Based Health Care Teachers & Developers (EBHC-TD) was hosted in Taormina (Sicily), November 2-6, 2005, by the GIMBE® (Gruppo Italiano per la Medicina Basata sulle Evidenze). The island of Sicily was an appropriate location as during its rich history, multiple nationalities have left their indelible mark on its cultural landscape and architecture, setting the stage beautifully for this conference where the relevance of strategies for teaching and developing evidencebased practice (EBP) knows no national or disciplinary boundaries. The beautiful seaside resort of Hotel Caparena, overlooked by the historic Greek Theatre on the outcroppings of the volcanic Mount Etna, lived up to its promise as a suitable forum-an intense intellectual exchange in a relaxed and informal atmosphere—of 100 registrants representing 20 countries from 5 continents of the world.

The theme was "Building Bridges between Research and Teaching," and the primary goals were to discover the current state of teaching and practice in EBP (key achievements and deficiencies) and to explore how the findings from current research on EBP can be incorporated into our teaching.

Plenaries, parallel sessions, posters, workshops, and theme groups were interspersed by time for networking. Throughout the 80 presentations given over 3 days by physicians, nurses, pharmacists, social workers, physiotherapists, veterinarians, policymakers, librarians, researchers, and educators working in settings ranging from primary to tertiary healthcare, academia, and government, several examples of research and real world applications of teaching and implementing EBP were given. Review of the abstracts and presentations at www.ebhc.org provides testament to the variety of tools and strategies that were shared.

Some presentation highlights included

- experiences of EBHC teaching in 13 countries and 5 continents;
- development of tools such as the "GATE approach" (Graphical Appraisal Tool for Epidemiology—see www.e-piq.co.nz) to teaching medical literature appraisal and the "evidence cube" approach to organising evidence-based knowledge;

- descriptions and evaluations of courses in EBP for medical and allied health professional students;
- evaluations of evidence-based decision making programmes implemented in the hospital and outpatient setting; teaching collaborations between continents (Africa–USA, New Zealand–Canada); and
- movements toward collaborative research in EBP.

As a result of this international collaboration—begun at the 1st (in 2001) and 2nd (in 2003) EBHC-TD Conferences in Sicily—the "Sicily Statement of Evidence-based Practice" has been published, and a new journal has been developed, Education for Evidence-Based Practice (EEBP), which will be launched by BMC journals in early 2006.

Feedback from the attendees was resoundingly positive, especially with gratitude for providing this unique and friendly forum to share tools, techniques, ideas, and programmes for EBP applied in different settings around the world. Attending delegates voted unanimously in favour of continuing to provide biennal EBHC-TD conferences, to be hosted by GIMBE® in Sicily—the symbolic representation of a safe middle ground to foster transprofessional and multinational collaboration toward the common goal of advancing EBP in the real world, around the world.

We suggest you mark in your diaries now: the 4th EBHC-TD Conference in Sicily will be held on October 31st-November 4th, 2007.




PROCESS OF EVIDENCE-BASED PRACTICE

- 5. Evaluation of performance












